BYLAW NO. 07 - 2022

A BYLAW TO AMEND BYLAW NO. 458, A BYLAW TO REGULATE GARBAGE COLLECTION

The Council of the Town of Fort Qu'Appelle in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts to amend Bylaw No. 458 as follows:

1. Removing the definition of "Householder" in Section 1 and adding the definition:

"Dwelling Unit means -

- (i) a single family home;
- (ii) each individual household with separate living accommodations within a single family home, multi-dwelling unit buildings with separate living accommodations, basement suites, duplexes, triplexes, fourplexes, and/or each unit within a multi-family building that has separate dwelling units. Sharing laundry facilities within, but not limited to, a single family dwelling, multi-dwelling unit, apartments, or condos does not consolidate the separated households into one household within the building. Renting of a bedroom room in a single family home that shares laundry, kitchen, and bathroom is not considered a separate dwelling unit."
- 2. Replacing the word "householder" within the entire Bylaw with the word "Dwelling Unit".
- 3. Delete Section 3 and replace with "Garbage carts will be brought to the street at the front of the property for pick up by 7:00 am the day of garbage pickup and will removed from the street no later than 48 hours after garbage pickup. When front property pickup cannot be accommodated, alternate pickup locations can be approved by the Public Works Manager. Garbage bags or any other refuse placed outside the cart will not be picked up.

4. Delete Section 4 and replace with "Each dwelling unit must have a 95-gallon cart that can be picked up by the Town's equipment and each dwelling unit is allowed a maximum of two 95-gallon carts and will be charged the standard fee for each care."
